H. O. HALE DIES IN FORT DODGE

Fort Dodge, Ia.—(AP)—Henry O. Hale, 69, one of Fort Dodge's wealthiest men, died Saturday in a hospital here after an illness of six weeks.

Hale had extensive property interests, including large tracts of farm land.

He was born in Kalo, Webster county, and lived in the county most of his life.

In 1938 he married Elizabeth C. Farley of Ogden, whose father was a coal mine operator. After her marriage she inherited a large sum of money, reported here to be about \$1,000,000.

A few years after her death Hale married Mrs. Cora Newton of Webster City. She is the only survivor.
